
Whiteside survey results - Fire Ant Eradication Program (Oct 24)


Hi Neighbour,




Have you ever seen, or suspect you have seen, fire ants in Whiteside?

Which of the below best describes your situation?




people should not be trying to access our property by just walking in, there are gates shut for a reason, and with pets on the property it is a hazard and a concern.

During the first poisoning, our neighbours horse had to be put down two weeks later from ingesting poison, a couple that walks our street had chickens die a few days later. In Samford red bass are found to be poisoned from fire Ant engage, the water way connected to north pine creek. I am very concerned with our wildlife, our lands and the pressure on us to "do the right thing". If Samford can ban this poison we can for Whiteside as well.

My horse had to be euthanised after ingesting fire ant treatment (it's in pellet form.. corn starch based). Sam ended up going down with a complete bowel obstruction & vets couldn't do anything for him as his gut was completely inflamed causing the obstruction. He had to be put out of his pain. He was a beautiful big boy who loved his food! They treated his paddock, I was at work! My dad consented to them coming in but dads had a stroke & did ask them not to go in with the horse! Toxicology came back from the vets and consistent with corn starch based poison. No animal should have to suffer the way my beautiful boy did. Im at Whiteside & feel very strongly about this
